A local, grass-roots effort is underway to bring a veterans memorial to the city of Bloomington

BLOOMINGTON — There are several dates each year on which Americans pay tribute to the men and women who have served in the military. However, we tend to dwell only on the sacrifice of the service members during times of conflict.

What about the sacrifice of those members in peace time? And the sacrifice family members make in supporting the service member? The veterans in Bloomington believe it is important to understand all these issues.

"Bloomington has always answered the call from its state and national government. The village of Bloomington, then only 1,000 people, contributed 60 volunteers to serve in the Civil War and Dakota Conflict. We have 62 veterans from the Civil War and even a Mexican War veteran buried here.

"Bloomington continued the tradition of patriotism in the subsequent conflicts of World War II, Korea, Vietnam, and the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. Despite this noble tradition we don't currently have a veterans memorial of our own. We intend to correct that now!" said longtime Bloomington resident and Vietnam Veteran Mike Dardis, a member of Minnesota American Legion at-large Post 1982.

He serves as vice president of Bloomington Remembers Veterans Inc., and is also a member of the organization's Board of Directors. Founded in 2018, the 501(c)3 nonprofit organization is working to provide the citizens of Bloomington, Minnesota with a meaningful, lasting tribute that honors both service members who have served this country in peace and war and their families.

Working in partnership with the City of Bloomington, the nonprofit has already selected a site — the East Lawn of the Civic Plaza. A memorial design that will be built by the Leo A. Daly architecture firm has been commissioned. (This is the company that also designed the World War II memorial in Washington D.C. and other local memorials such as the Fireman's Memorial in St. Paul).

The nonprofit has also begun privately fundraising needed to build The Bloomington Veterans Memorial. One hundred percent of the funding for the memorial's construction is coming from private donations. No tax money will go toward the memorial.

The \$750,000 project is conceived as a series of experiences embedded on a path that will serve to honor, remember and share the stories of Bloomington's veterans and their families. The winning design concept showcases the journey veterans and their families travel as well as the sacrifices made during the course of their service.

The design features two symbolic walking paths: one for the veteran and the other for

the family.

The paths meet at a flagpole flying the American and Prisoner-of-War (POW) flags. The flagpole, and the plaza surrounding it, will be the centerpiece serving as a backdrop for community activities and gatherings, and the visible connection to the stories of Bloomington veterans.

The design also features lighted circular platforms engraved with the symbols representing each of the six military branches — Army, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard, Air Force, Space Force — and six armatures from which individual recognition will be provided through symbolic dog tags that can be hung from each arm.

Further along is a place for quiet reflection and healing featuring seating and a vertical light source to reflect the spirit of the service members and their families. "The memorial will not only pay tribute to the service members and their families, but be a place to aid in the healing of those who have born the full brunt of the burden of service," said Fran Stachour, secretary, Bloomington Remembers Veterans Inc., and a member of the Board of Directors.

In addition to having the support of Bloom-

ington Mayor Tim Busse and the entire City Council, the Bloomington Veterans Memorial also has the support of Minnesota Congressman Dean Phillips.

"Creating a dedicated space to honor our veterans in a public gathering area such as this will serve as a wonderful and lasting testament to the great reverence our community has for the service of our American heroes, and also the sacrifices that they and their families have made for the freedoms that all of us enjoy today," he said.

Congressman Phillips is the son of a veteran. His father died in 1969 while serving in Vietnam.

Terry Collins, president of Bloomington Remembers Veterans Inc., and a member of the Board of Directors, said the organization's goal is to have at least half of the \$750,000 required for the memorial raised by the end of the first quarter in 2022. So far, only a small percentage of the funding has been secured.

What the organization is calling "The Fall of Fundraising" kicked off recently. "Our goal over the next quarter is to get appointments with key people who can help raise those big chunks of money we need. We are going to be asking for help from people who have ties to Bloomington, have business arrangements here. We're looking at educational and cultural sources as well," he said.

Bloomington Remembers Veterans Inc. is staffed by an all-volunteer committee of dedicated community members, the majority of whom are veterans from several different branches of the armed forces. The organization will be overseeing the memorial's construction, then plans to turn the site over to the City of Bloomington to maintain it.
